

It should also be noted the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) now recommends that individuals who are NOT fully vaccinated shall be required to cover their nose and mouth with a face covering in a public place and are unable to maintain a 6-foot social distance. This requirement applies whether in an indoor space, such as a store, or in a public outdoor space were maintaining a 6-foot social distance is not always possible.


HOSPITALITY ROOMS

Pre-register and acquire badges for Minneapolis

Pre-registration for the Minneapolis Grand Lodge Convention opened on April 1st, at https://www.elks.org/convention/prereg.cfm, and will remain open through June 28.

The online pre-registration fee is \$50 for all Members, while the on-site registration fee will be \$60. A current credit card for PayPal will be needed. There is no fee for a non-Elk spouse or guest.

On-site registration will open on Friday, June 30, from noon to 4 p.m. When you arrive at the Minneapolis convention center, go to the designated pre-registration line in the Registration area. You will need your e-mail confirmation and current membership card to receive credentials (and voting credentials, if qualified) for you and your spouse or guest. A registration badge will be required to enter the exhibit hall and all business sessions.

All non-Elk guests, including widows and widowers of Elks, must register at the Guest Registration Station at the convention center to obtain registration badges. Guests need a badge to enter the exhibit hall, see the Installation of Grand Lodge Officers, or attend any other events where they are permitted. Be advised Exhibits/ Vendors will not open until 8:00 a.m. Saturday morning.

Grand Lodge registration and its required fee are not included in any State Association's "package" arrangement. You can also register thru the IEA with the form below.

Joliet #296 had a very busy winter of Caring and Sharing.

The Lodge used its \$2000 check from the Illinois Elks Association (IEA) as a donation to the Warriors for the Children Organization. This organization meets at the Lodge on a monthly basis and provides services to children of physical, emotional, verbal and sexual abuse.

The Lodge used a \$1000 Veterans check from the IEA to make a donation to Catholic Charities of Joliet Supportive Services for Veterans Families Program.

The Lodge used its \$2000 Spotlight Grant to provide over 150 winter clothing items to the Morning Star Mission in Joliet and a monetary donation to help in providing meals for families that stay at the shelter.


Brookfield # 1510 delivers coats and cash to Beds Plus organization


THAT'S A BULLSEYE FOR THE CCC!
